A gift to The Fund for Providence College is an invaluable – and powerful – opportunity to give to what you love. PC is a transformational place, and The Fund for Providence College ensures that its future continues to shine bright. It sustains everything that makes a PC education distinctive: the Catholic and Dominican values that unite the campus community in the search for *Veritas*, the spirit of the Friar family during every athletics game, and the supportive and hard-working student culture. Your support guarantees that this special place — a place you love — continues its positive trajectory while remaining loyal to its roots.

## **What is The Fund for Providence College?**

The Fund for Providence College is PC's annual fund. It provides funds that can be used immediately and flexibly, giving the College's leaders the ability to respond to the needs of today's students. Taken together, these gifts directly strengthen the College's current fiscal health and have a powerful impact. Donors to The Fund for Providence College may choose to direct their gifts where they're needed most, or to emergency student support, varsity athletics, or financial aid.

## **How do gifts to The Fund for Providence College differ from endowment gifts?**

Gifts to The Fund for Providence College are put to use immediately and directed to the areas where they are most urgently needed, whereas the endowment provides a permanent source of income for the College. It's helpful to think of The Fund for Providence College as the College's checking account, and the endowment as the College's savings account.

PC relies heavily on The Fund for Providence College because our endowment (currently at \$244M) is not as robust as our peers. One dollar to The Fund for Providence College is equivalent to \$23 of PC endowment, based on a 4.5% payout. Magnify this ratio of 1:23 and the impact of the annual fund looks like this:

\$5M of annual fund dollars = \$112M of endowment

## **What happened to the previous giving allocations?**

As a PC donor, you choose where your money goes. We believe that your donation experience should be as easy and transparent as possible. This renaming simplifies the giving process while providing added clarity about the direct impact of your gift.
